## Job Description

SWAN is looking for an experienced English as a Second Language (ESL) Community Language Instructor with a passion for social justice. This is a unique opportunity for folks interested in bringing together their ESL training and their enthusiasm for anti-racist, equity-seeking work in and alongside communities.

This is a contract position for 10 hours per week (4 hours instruction time).

The successful candidate must bring a culturally-sensitive, trauma-informed approach to their teaching practice that centres student success, in all the ways that shows up. The instructor must be able to work with adult learners starting from a variety of levels of English proficiency, from beginner to intermediate.

- \* TESL certificate (CELTA a bonus) or equivalent experience (e.g. education degree)
- \* A minimum of one year's experience teaching ESL to adults is preferred
- \* Cantonese and/or Mandarin proficiency is considered an asset
- Values align with SWAN's organizational values

\* Prepare course materials for, administrate, and teach two two-hour hybrid (online & in-person) English classes (beginner & intermediate) per week between 10am – 3 pm
